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## March Budget (see Newsletter #9)

- DfF approval granted for Westen Gateway to proceed with a full business case submission (expected first half 2021)
- Confirmation that the proposal for a new A46 relief road will be a dual and not single carriageway

## Western Gateway (WG)

- As advised in January, that WG have submitted their Strategic Outline Business case for the M5/J9 A46 scheme in January and no details will be shared due to confidentiality issues/absence of confirmed funding.
- Subject to DfT feedback/approval [now confirmed], the detailed Business Case will be prepared and submitted in 2021. It is thought that public consultation will be scheduled prior to submission.
- WG have launched a new website.

## Ashchurch Concept Masterplan/Tewkesbury Garden Town

- Still quiet, no updates beyond Ashchurch bridge project.

## GCC Local Transport Plan Consultation

- Consultation ended 26<sup>th</sup> March 2020
- TAAG reviewed the plan and submitted individual feedback using prescribed forms and sent in a separate summary of key points
- CPRE also provided robust feedback and were also very critical of how user unfriendly the consultation paper was

## Environmental Impact Project

- A meeting with Green party representatives has been postponed due to current covid-19 restrictions
- GCC Environment Scrutiny Committee held most recent meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> March

## Midlands Connect – A46 Corridor Study

- We have chased the missing Stage 2 transport study and been told they are engaging with local councils on findings but have no timeframe for publishing

## Councillor Vernon Smith surgery - 29<sup>th</sup> February

- Members of TAAG met with Laurence Robertson MP and Councillors Smith and Moore. This had been followed up with further contact with Councillor Moore to seek answers on how council environmental policies are and will be reflected in new development proposals
